## ARMY INTER UNIT CHAMPIONSHIP CATTERICK GOLF CLUB 10 - 12 JUN 24 - ADMIN INSTRUCTION

## General

- 1. Introduction. The 2024 Army Inter Unit Golf Championship is open to all units of the Army stationed in the UK and Overseas. It will take place at Catterick Golf Club (CGC).
- 2. **Programme**. The programme for the Championship is as follows:

By Fri 31 May 24 Entry forms to AGA Assistant Secretary. a. b. Wed 5 Jun 24 Publication of the instruction for the Finals. Mon 10 Jun 24 Practice round available from 1400 hrs. C. Finals. d.

Tue 11 & Wed 12 Jun 24

- **Entries**. The event will comprise a maximum of 24 teams; if more than 24 entries are received, there will be a ballot based on the combined handicap of the teams, with the lowest 24 going through. Entry forms must be submitted via the AGA Website – www.armygolf.co.uk and both the form and payment are to be with the AGA Assistant Secretary by 1230 hrs on Fri 31 May 24.
- 4. Composition of Teams. Throughout the Championship, teams will comprise 3 players of any gender and a reserve (if required) all of whom must be serving personnel of either a Regular or Reserve unit and who must be formally taken on strength (TOS) of the unit they represent. Every player must hold a WHS handicap in order to play in this event. If they are not a member of a club, they can still obtain a WHS handicap via the iGolf platform - https://englandigolf.co.uk/. Players may only represent one team in the Championship; Reference A, Page 5/4-3, Paragraph 5.058b refers. The reserve may play in any match as required by the Team Captain.

## **Competition Format**

- 5. Championship.
  - General. The finals are organised by the AGA Tournament Committee and will take place on Tue 11 & Wed 12 Jun 24 at Catterick Golf Club. The course will be available to teams for practice on Mon 10 Jun 24 from 1400 hrs, tee-times are to be booked through the Pro Shop. Payment for the practice round is an individual responsibility.
  - Entry Fee. There will be an entry fee of £120 per team. The entry fee will b. include competition green fees (not the practice round), prizes, coffee each morning and lunch for a team of 3 (+ one reserve) on both competition days.
  - **Format**. On Day One, Tue 11 Jun 24, all teams will take part in a handicap Stableford event played over 36 holes starting on both the 1st and 10th tees with all three scores to count. On Day Two, Tue 12 Jun 24, the top 4 teams will qualify for the Main Championship (The Balfour Trophy), the next 4 teams into the Plate Championship (India Cup) and the remainder will play a 27-hole handicap Stableford

team event. The Matchplay format will be singles Matchplay off handicap with the full allowance.

- d. **Scoring**. In the Main and Plate competition, one point will be awarded for a win, half a point for a halved match and zero for a loss. In the event of a tie between two teams, the team winning scores for the matches will be added together to determine the result. For example if Team A wins one match 5/4 and Team B win one match 2/1 with the other drawn then Team A will go through with 5 points against 2. If however, the result is still level, then **one player from each team, nominated by the Team Captain**, will play sudden death over holes prescribed by the Championship Committee.
- 6. **Accommodation**. Accommodation is an individual unit responsibility.
- 7. **Travel at Public Expense**. Travel is authorised in accordance with **2019DIN10-025**. Every effort must be made to minimise publicly funded travel costs by sharing vehicles.
- 8. **Final Instructions**. Detailed instructions for the Finals will be issued to all Teams on Wed 5 Jun 24.
- 9. **On Duty Status**. Team Captains should advise their RAO to ensure that their participation in the event has been published on respective Unit Part 1 Orders, to formalise their 'on duty' status for this event.
